*When this had dawned on him, he went to the house of Mary the mother of John, also called Mark, where many people had gathered and were praying. Peter knocked at the outer entrance, and a servant named Rhoda came to answer the door. When she recognized Peter's voice, she was so overjoyed she ran back without opening it and exclaimed, "Peter is at the door!" "You're out of your mind," they told her. When she kept insisting that it was so, they said, "It must be his angel." But Peter kept on knocking, and when they opened the door and saw him, they were astonished.*

**Acts 12:12-16**

### **When To Stop Praying**

While Peter was in prison awaiting execution, the church was gathered in Jerusalem and "praying earnestly" for him. The strange story, recorded in Acts 12, says that an angel appeared and released Peter in the middle of the night. But when he arrived at the home where the church was secretly praying, no one believed he was at the door. Only a young servant girl, Rhoda, believed it was really Peter. The adults, still fervently praying, told her she was crazy.

Scripture repeatedly calls us to pray, to appeal to God with our needs, and to seek his favor for both our friends and our enemies. This is exactly what the believers in Jerusalem were obediently doing for Peter. Scripture, however, does not call us to only pray. We must also discern when the time for intercession has ended and we are called to move on.

There is a time for prayer, and there is a time for action. There is a time to cry out to God, and there is a time to claim his victory. There is a time to seek his intervention, and a time to accept his answer. There is a time to ask for his wisdom, and a time to simply obey his command. There is a time to be on our knees, and a time to get up and open the door.

Our failure to discern these moments arises from a popular view that falsely equates prayer with piety and action with its absence. The critical issue is not whether we pray or act, but whether we pray or act *in faith*. The prayers of a thousand priests, prophets, pastors, or preachers are meaningless if they pray without faith. It is meaningless if they are not willing to look at how they may be used to by God to answer the prayers they give.

The failure to be moved to act in the same way we are praying is why a jaded world doesn't think very highly of (what should be) a powerful phrase: "my thoughts and prayers are with you." The world hears the prayers, but doesn't see the ones giving the prayers always acting in the same faith the prayer tries to proclaim. They want God's people (and so does God by the way) to do more than only pray. In the words of Pope Francis "You pray for the hungry. Then you feed them. That's how prayer works."

I don't just pray for my neighbors; I actively look to help them. I don't just pray for a kinder world; I treat all people, even the troublesome ones, with kindness and respect.

I wonder how many times, like the Christians in Jerusalem, I have failed to see God's goodness because I could not discern when to stop praying.

Still praying, and trying to pay attention of when being called to act...just as you do the same!




