Repent and Heal

During the worship services over the next few weeks, we are talking about sin and repentance. I thought I would take this time to talk a little about repentance and why it is crucial in a relationship with God.

In the New Testament, the word *repent* simply means to turn around. Spiritually, it means to change from a heart bent on self-rule. It's about a heart attitude that confesses to (or agrees with) God and seeks God's glory, God's way and God's will.

With that in mind here 6 basic principles of repentance to reflect on.

- <u>1: Confess</u>. Repentant people are willing to confess all their sins, not just the sins that got them in trouble. A house isn't clean until you open every closet and sweep every corner. People who truly desire to be clean are completely honest about their lives. No more secrets.
- <u>2. Face the Pain.</u> Repentant people face the pain that their sin caused others. They invite the victims of their sin (anyone hurt by their actions) to express the intensity of emotions that they feel—anger, hurt, sorrow, and <u>disappointment</u>. Repentant people do not give excuses or shift blame. They made the choice to hurt others, and they must take full responsibility for their behavior.
- <u>3. Ask for Forgiveness.</u> Repentant people <u>ask for forgiveness</u> from those they hurt. They realize that they can never completely "pay off" the debt they owe their victims. Repentant people don't pressure others to say "<u>I</u> <u>forgive you.</u>" Forgiveness is a journey, and the other person needs time to deal with the hurt before they can forgive. All that penitent people can do is admit their indebtedness and humbly request the undeserved gift of forgiveness.
- **4. Remain Accountable.** Repentant people remain accountable to a small group of mature Christians. They gather a group of friends around themselves who hold them accountable to a plan for clean living. They invite the group to question them about their behaviors. And they follow the group's recommendations regarding how to avoid temptation.
- <u>5. Accept Their Limitations.</u> Repentant people accept their limitations. They realize that the consequences of their sin (including the distrust) will last a long time, perhaps the rest of their lives. They understand that they may never enjoy the same freedom that other people enjoy.

Addicts, for example, should change locations and people they were once around. Alcoholics must abstain from drinking. Those spending too much time online may need programs that limit their times. Any area that may cause temptation, must be avoided, or when not able remove themselves, they may need to be monitored and have someone around to help keep the repentant person accountable.

6. Faithful to God-Given Tasks. Repentant people are faithful to the daily tasks God has given them. We serve a merciful God who delights in giving second chances. God offers repentant people a restored and a new plan for life.
