What Do Our Sacrifices Mean

In the last few weeks, Paul's writings in 1 Corinthians chapters 8-10 have been speaking something to me (still chewing on it honestly). The verses discuss if it is ok to eat meat that has been sacrificed to Idols. Paul says eating the meat is not really the issue. The issue is really about evaluating your thoughts, words and actions and asking if your life as a person of faith invites people to God, or does it encourage idol worship. Near the end of Chapter 10 he says

1 Corinthians 10:23-24

" "Everything is permissible, "but not everything is beneficial. "Everything is permissible," but not everything builds up. No one is to seek his own good, but the good of the other person." CSB Version

While we as people of faith believe this, we should also be asking if our thoughts, words, actions and posts are at risk of laying something down at the feet of idols. Those idols could look like: Anger, fear, security, possessions, wealth, and comfort.

There are real issues in our world, country, and homes. The culture at large has always been, but is currently rampant with, "Me First." What would it truly look like if we did not give over to the idols but truly did reach out to even our enemies, opponents, those who we don't agree with or even the ones we may not know why but we just don't like, in conversations that HEARD them.

And what if we did it NOT because an agency or an institution said we had to, but because as people of faith that is what we strive to do.

As Holy week is just around the corner we will have a massive example of what looks like to not live for ourselves, but be willing to sacrifice so that others may have life. That others will find hope. That others will find grace. And the amazing thing is, that as we live that life out, we will find it for ourselves as well.

Know you are loved, and I am praying for your physical, emotional, mental and spiritual health! I am also praying that these are not just words for me but that this idea actually drives my thoughts, words, actions and posts.
